Small Group Discussion Guide

Icebreaker: Jesus was a master teacher, using questions very effectively. Share about one of your favorite teachers in your school days, and why they were a favorite.

Discussion Questions

1. Share something that impressed you, challenged you, or raised a question from our study of Matthew 22:41-46.

2. Why does Jesus use questions so much in His teaching? Why is the question in vv 41-42 so good?

3. How does Jesus use Psalm 110:1 to confront them with the truth of His Deity? What does this truth mean to you?

4. Why was no one “able to answer Him” and why did they not “dare to question Him anymore?” (v.46)

Digging Deeper:

Take a closer look at Psalm 110. What are some great truths about Jesus that are seen in this vivid messianic psalm?

How is Psalm 110:1 used in Acts 2:34-35? 1 Cor 15:25? Heb 1:13? and Heb 10:13? Note the context of each of these verses.

Read Matthew 21-22 and note how the details of chapter 21 set the stage for the encounters Christ faces in chapter 22 and following.
